Dear Parents/Carers, we year 6s, previously called Buddies, are renaming ourselves to The Helping Hands. We are here for everyone, at any time whether it's a problem on the playground, or confidence issues in lessons, we are there for your child/children.

We are very approachable, to say in the least, and you can find us on the playground with orange high visibility jackets, and rainbow lanyards with our names on.

We have a "drop box" where your child can put their name and class in, where we will call them to come with us to have a private chat. To sort out their problems, we will keep all problems and issues confidential unless it gets too serious, then we might have to tell an adult in school. We will let them choose which adult, so they feel relaxed with that trusted adult.

Aiming to be great role models, on Mondays and Wednesdays we spend time with children in one to one sessions to improve there learning, confidence, and WWO skills as well as having lunch with them on Fridays. A message from our Learning Mentor Mrs. Bicknell

Hello,

I would like to introduce myself as the Learning Mentor in School. I have 12 years experience of working with children, in a range of schools and children centre environments. I have been at Colgate Primary School since 2005. I have worked with children of all ages, and with a wide range of additional needs.

My role is to support all our children and their families. I will be working with children, parents/carers, school staff and outside staff to provide the best solution for children who are experiencing problems to overcome any barriers to learning. I will listen to children, offering support and practical advice in order for them to achieve the best they can whilst at Colgate Primary School. Barriers to learning can be things like:

Family difficulties
Lack of social skills
Friendship difficulties
Lack of confidence and/or low self esteem
Bereavement
Bullying
Medical needs
Low concentration
Anger/Behaviour
Specific difficulties
The list goes on...

I can offer one to one or small group work which will be tailored to meet the needs of the children concerned. This could be time to talk, calming sessions, more structured work or informal play – it all depends on the individual child, what we are focusing on and sometimes the day it is!

I am happy and available to meet with parents/carers to discuss any difficulties and plan a way forward, or even just for an informal chat to say hello. I am often on the playground in the mornings so you can say hello then, or if you would like a more specific appointment please ring on the school number.

Registering for Free School Meals could raise money for our school!

Registering for a free school meal eligibility check could raise an extra grant of £1,320 per year, per child, for our school, or £935 per child for secondary schools, to fund valuable support like extra tuition, additional teaching staff or after school activities.

This additional money is available from the government for every child whose parent is receiving one of the state benefits listed below. It is therefore important to register for a free school meal eligibility check, even if your child is in reception, year 1 or year 2, so that your child's school receives as much funding as possible.

FAMILY INCOME AND BENEFIT DETAILS

Are you in receipt of any of the benefits listed?

- Income support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support from National Asylum Support Service (NASS) under part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit only, provided your annual household income (as assessed by HM Revenue & Customs) does not exceed £16,190. Anyone entitled to Working Tax Credit is not entitled to free meals regardless of income
 Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for WTC
- Universal Credit (with no element of Working Tax Credit)

If you are not eligible for benefits related free school meals, but your child is currently in Reception, year 1 or year 2, they will be automatically entitled to Universal Infant Free School Meals and you need not apply. Please contact your school for details.

If you are eligible for benefits related free school meals in accordance with the above criteria and your child is also receiving Universal Infant Free School Meals please continue to register as this will enable your child's school to claim valuable 'pupil premium' funding
