The children have self directed time where they are encouraged to practice key skills linked to previous learning but they also have time to follow their own ideas.






Visual timetable

The children have daily reading and writing experiences.

We are reading our way to a better life. Research shows that reading for pleasure can promote better health and wellbeing, aids in building social connections and relationships with others.



Year 2 will sit a reading comprehension test in June 2023. Writing will be teacher assessed using the national framework.

How are we feeling today?

Personal, Social and Health Education

- Every morning as we do the register and throughout the day we check in with the children. This is an opportunity to share how we are feeling and reflect on why this might be. The children have started to relate colours to feelings.
- We encourage the children to try and sort disagreements with friends themselves but at this age adult intervention is often needed to help children find compromises.
- We work towards a class reward. This is filling a jar with small cubes. Children can also receive stickers from adults and visit Mrs Winn.
- We use our school motto of being our best to encourage good behaviour. We talk about making good choices and using kind hands and words.




Daily phonics

Most of the class are taught in their year group for phonics. Some children may spend some time in a different group if they have yet to confidently learn and apply the graphemes taught previously.















Year 1 will complete a phonic screening check in June 2023.

Year 2 will children who did not pass will resit it in June 2023.




We are no longer using reading colours. The children's reading books will be easy as these books are for revision of known sounds. Reading the same book three times is recommended so that your child can read with greater fluency and understanding.



We change our reading books on a Monday and a Friday. We also offer a story book to take home each week.

Adults will read with your child 1:1 as often as possible but this would be to assess their progress or to check if the books are suitable. Whole class reading will happen weekly. Children will be reading challenging texts out loud with an adult and to a partner.









Year 2 start to join with lead ins and lead outs with an expectation to be joining by the end of Year 2.







Year 1 complete fine motor activities with equipment such as buttons, shoe laces and tweezers or draw patterns.


Year 2 will sit two maths papers in June 2022; arithmetic and reasoning.

Spooky Spellings


We use this in school and is a great way to practice spelling all the tricky words Year 1 and Year 2 need to be able to read and spell.
