Governor information

I am delighted to become a parent governor at Colgate. I have two children at the school - Noah in Cedar class, and Nat in Maple class. We have lived in Colgate since moving from my hometown of Brighton eleven years ago. Coming from a family of teachers, education has always been important to me, but my career has been in the corporate sector, starting in financial services and now working in healthcare for a digital health provider. I feel incredibly fortunate to live in a village with such a great community and a school that is so warm, inclusive, and committed to its

As a new academic year gets underway we wanted to explain the role of Governors at the school. The Colgate Governing Body consists of 12 Governors, as follows:

- 3 x Parent Governors
- 6 x Co-opted Governors
- 1 x Local Authority Governor
- 1 x Head Teacher
- 1 x Staff Governor

We also have 1 or 2 Associate Members to the Governing Body who are appointed to one of our two committees based on their specific skill set.

In the words of Governors Services at West Sussex County Council, 'Governors have a critical role to play in influencing the overall culture of the organisation'. The three core strategic roles are:

• Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction.

• Holding executive leaders to account for the educational performance of the organisation and its pupils, and the performance management of staff.

• Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent, including pupil premium.

Governors are all volunteers (except the Headteacher) who are keen to support the school, whether teachers, parents, grandparents, neighbours or members of the local community. We meet regularly through Full Governing Body and Committee meetings, as well as undertaking multiple visits to the school to undertake Learning Walks, support school events (Sport Day, School Plays etc), through affiliations to individual classes and having Link Governor roles (e.g. Safeguarding and SEND).
