Here is an outline of our learning for the Autumn Term. Our learning will be linked to the question 'What happens at night?' and we will be learning about nocturnal animals such as owls as well as other aspects of night time.

The learning for Year One children will be linked to the National Curriculum and for Reception, it will be linked to the seven areas of the Early Years Curriculum. However, although the Reception children will join in with some of the topic learning, they will spend the majority of their time pursuing their own interests whilst learning through play. Reception will have Phonics, Maths, English, PSHE and PE lessons once we have completed all of our baseline assessments.

Monday and Friday- we will be changing reading books on these days so please ensure books are in book bags. We will give out reading books to Reception around half term, once we have covered the first set of sounds in Phonics.

Friday- we will be issuing new Apple Class library books so please return them if you would like a new one. The box will be in our outside area so that you can choose one with your child.

Please ensure PE kits are in school at all times. Our PE days will be Monday and Wednesday but there are occasions where we may need to swap our days around. Please ensure all uniform and PE kit is labelled with your child's name as this will help us to get the children changed more quickly and allow us to return any lost clothing!
