How we learn in Year 1/2

FYI

Visual timetable

The children have self directed time at least twice a day where they are encouraged to practice key skills linked to previous learning but they also have time to follow their own ideas.



Every morning we talk about the days of the week, months of the year and the seasons. This is something you can do at home to help develop a sense of the passing of time.



Personal, Social and Health Education



- Every morning as we do the register and throughout the day we check in with the children. This is an opportunity to share how we are feeling and reflect on why this might be. The children have started to relate colours to feelings.
- We encourage the children to try and sort disagreements with friends themselves but at this age adult intervention is often needed to help children find compromises. These are life skills.
- We work towards a class reward. These are called Dojo points. These are monitored to ensure that they are fairly awarded. Children can also be awarded the purple chair, receive stickers from adults and visit Mrs Winn.
- We use our school motto of being our best to encourage good behaviour. We talk about making good choices and using kind hands and words.



English

The children have daily reading and writing experiences. Children are heard read 1:1, in small groups or during whole sessions depending on their age, confidence and ability.



We are reading our way to a better life. Research shows that reading for pleasure can promote better health and wellbeing, aids in building social connections and relationships with others.

Year 2 will no longer sit tests in June known as SATS. Teacher assessment using the national curriculum will take place every term and at the end of year.

Daily phonics

Most of the class are taught in their year group for phonics. Some children may spend some time in a different group if they have yet to confidently learn and apply the graphemes taught previously.



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Song of Sounds has been validated by the DFE but there have been some changes. Some sounds have moved songs and some new sounds have been added. The children are starting to learn their new songs this week.



Year 1 will complete a phonic screening check in June 2023.

Year 2 children who did not pass will resit it in June 2023.




We are no longer using reading colours. The children's reading books will seem easy as these books are for revision of known sounds. They should not be hard. Reading the same book three times is recommended so that your child can read with greater fluency and then understanding.

> We change our reading books on a Monday and a Friday. We also offer a story book to take home each week.





Adults will read with your child from time to time but this would be to assess their progress or to check if the books are suitable. Whole class reading will happen for Year 2 when they are ready. Children will be reading challenging texts out loud with an adult and to a partner.







Year 2 start to join with lead ins and lead outs with an expectation to be joining by the end of Year 2.




Writing

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
