Finally, sitting on the yellow zigzags is also causing blocks, this is purely a drop off zone as any car staying in the zone prevents the traffic moving along the road and this is when arguments occur which are unpleasant for everyone. Your children's safety is paramount and let's all work together to keep this working as well as we can.

It's our Harvest Service at the church on Friday October 12th at 9.15am. We hope you can join us and we would welcome non perishable food donations here at the school from Monday October 8th. All donations will be sent to the Open House project in Crawley which is a refuge for homeless young people.
